## Coronavirus Update: New Cases in Plano\*

\* Collin County Health Care Services (CCHCS) reports a significant adjustment in reported cases. Data from the Texas Health Trace System identified 345 cases that are either duplicates or transferred to other counties. These cases have been included on the County's dashboard since June 1. The adjustment will result in a decrease in confirmed, active and recovered cases reported out today. It is estimated to be between 6 and 10 percent lower than Thursday's posted counts. Age, gender and zip code totals have not been adjusted as of this morning.

CCHCS reports hospitalization data for today's update is unavailable.

DSHS reported 170 new cases in Collin County, including 34 in Plano. The adjusted total number of positive cases in Collin County is 5,571, including 1,463 in Plano. The County has 1,081 active cases, including 243 in Plano.

There are 19 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 7 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,482.
