Between June 24 to June 26, DSHS reported 218 new cases in Collin County, including 43 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 5,589, including 1,504 in Plano. The County has 1,118 active cases, including 260 in Plano.

There are 21 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 8 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,525.
