The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 209 new cases in Collin County, including 73 in Plano. These are single day highs since the pandemic began. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 6,147, including 1,612 in Plano. The County has 1,408 active cases, including 355 in Plano.

Collin County reported 5 COVID-19 related deaths Tuesday, including two in Plano. A 56-year-old Plano woman died at a local hospital. She was the first fatality in Collin County who did not have an underlying health condition. An 83-year-old Plano Man with an underlying health condition died at Brookdale Collin Oaks Assisted Living and Memory Care. An 81-year-old Dallas Man with an underlying health condition died at Farmersville Health and Rehabilitation. An 84-year-old Murphy woman with an underlying health condition died at Lynride Assisted Living and Memory Care. A 66-year-old Wylie man with an underlying health condition died at a local hospital.

There are 21 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 8 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,633.
