Between July 31 to August 2, DSHS reported 150 new cases in Collin County, including 36 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 6,403, including 1,688 in Plano. The County has 1,463 active cases, including 361 in Plano.

There are 22 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 9 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 1,710.
