The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 226 new cases in Collin County, including 50 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 8,052, including 2,061 in Plano. The County has 2,732 active cases, including 642 in Plano.

There are 26 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 15 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 2,087.

The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) reported three new COVID-19 related deaths, including a 92-year-old Plano man with underlying health conditions, who died August 9 at a local hospital. A 59-year-old Princeton woman with underlying health conditions died August 2 at a local hospital. A 91-year-old Frisco man with underlying health conditions died at the Vitas Inpatient Unit.
