The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 149 new cases in Collin County, including 29 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is 8,445, including 2,156 in Plano. The County has 3,062 active cases, including 720 in Plano.

There are 26 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 16 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 2,182.

DSHS reported a COVID-19 related death in McKinney. A 65-year-old man with underlying health conditions died August 13 at a local hospital. It was the County's 94th death from Coronavirus.
