The totals in the data box above may fluctuate based on cases that have been transferred, duplicates or previously unreported from previous days.

DSHS reported 168 new cases in Collin County, including 33 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is now 10,169, including 2,622 in Plano. The County has 4,632 active cases, including 1,152 in Plano.

There are 27 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 19 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 2,649.

DSHS reported 3 new COVID-19 related deaths, including an 87-year-old Plano woman with underlying health conditions. A 96-year-old Wylie woman with underlying health conditions died August 15 at Garnet Hill Rehab and Skilled Nursing. An 80-year-old Wylie man with underlying health conditions died August 14 at Garnet Hill Rehab & Skilled Nursing. The total number of COVID-19 related deaths is now 101 in Collin County, including 26 in Plano.
