Coronavirus Update: New Cases in Plano*

*Seven deaths were removed from Collin County's total. County officials stopped reporting deaths locally and began using data from the Department of State Health Services. According to the County's public information officer, the change was made because the State has access to death certificates of Collin residents who died outside the county. This should standardize the death count. He expects the State numbers to "lag a bit."

DSHS reported 44 new cases in Collin County, including 12 in Plano. The total number of positive cases in Collin County is now 10,451, including 2,683 in Plano. The County has 4,636 active cases, including 1,144 in Plano.

There are 27 positive cases in the Denton County portion of Plano. 19 have recovered. With the Denton County cases, the total number of positive cases in Plano is 2,710.
