We are excited to be able to share with you this new program designed to provide enhanced and protection to our citizens.


The Plano Police Department strongly believes, and tries to instill the same philosophy in others, that it is by working together that we can make Plano an even better place in which we live.




The "Take Me Home" program is a database system developed by the Pensacola Florida Police Department for adults and children who may have difficulty communicating due to a developmental or cognitive disability. The database is only accessible to law enforcement personnel and includes a picture, their disability information, a physical description, and emergency contact information for all registered individuals. If a person in the "Take Me Home" program is encountered by a Police Officer, the database can be used to quickly access critical information that may help in communicating with the individual and appropriate assist the individual.

This program is a free service available to any City of Plano resident who may have trouble communicating and is aimed at individuals with Autism, Down Syndrome, developmental or cognitive disabilities. The program is also intended to assist senior citizens who suffer from dementia or Alzheimer's. All information is kept confidential.
