Introduction

This class is an introduction to the Lynda.com site. It provides a very simple overview of basics tasks you can perform in Lynda.com.

This class will not teach you how to use the internet, how to set up an email account, or basic computer skills.

What can I do with a free Lynda.com account?

- Learn what you want, when, and where you want
- Web-based video tutorials focus on the information you need
- Video tutorials in software, design, and business skills
 - High quality, current, and engaging
 - Taught by recognized industry experts in five languages
- More than 6,000 courses new videos added every month
- Organized as:
 - Videos follow along tutorials with transcript
 - Courses collection of videos on a subject
 - Playlists collection of courses and videos on a subject
 - Learning Paths collection of courses and videos on a specific career

Create an account and fill out your profile information

- Planolibrary.org > Learn > Research & Learn > H-N > Lynda.com Link
- Sign in with your library card number and PIN (last four digits of your phone number)
 - You will have the option to create a profile with interests specific to you. You will need to include your email address

Already have a Lynda.com account?

• You can bring your course history, playlists, certificates of completion, and bookmarks to your new lynda.com profile. You might have created an account while attending college or on the job. If you already have a Lynda.com account, choose I have an account. On the next page, just enter the user name and password for your previous account, and your history will be transferred to your new profile.

Do I need special software to use Lynda.com?

- No extra software is required
- For the best learning experience, you should follow along with your own software during the video tutorial
 - Example: If you're doing a Photoshop class, you would have Photoshop installed on your computer, have it open, and follow along
- Plano Library's Digital Creation Spaces available at Haggard and Parr
 - Ages 13+
 - The Digital Creation Spaces offer access to digital media technologies and equipment to accommodate individual or group multimedia projects. Equipment includes PC workstations equipped with Adobe Creative Cloud and Microsoft Office Suite, headphones, USB microphone, digital camera/SLR, tripod, pen tablet, color image scanner and green screen

Note: Lynda.com doesn't provide the software associated with course videos. If you don't have the application used in the course, you can still learn a great deal. Some fundamental concepts can even be applied to other software applications.

Your Homepage

- · Four major panels
 - Continue Watching
 - ☐ Videos you have watched or are in the process of watching
 - My Playlists
 - ☐ Any playlists you have added, either curated ones, or those you have created
 - Popular Learning Paths
 - ☐ Your chosen Learning Paths or popular learning paths
 - Recommendations
 - ☐ What's new and popular, or what's popular in your organization

Playlists

Playlists are an essential tool for organizing Lynda.com courses and tracking progress.

- Create and share playlists
- Organizations can assign playlists to team members to facilitate training
- No limit to the number of playlists you can make

Creating Lynda.com Playlists

- Sign in to your Lynda.com account
- 2. Hover over Hi, [Your Name] and click Playlists
- 3. Click Create new playlist
- 4. Enter the Name of the playlist (required) and Description (optional)
- 5. Click Save

Note: In some views, you may see the option to Create rather than to Save your new playlist.

Adding a Lynda.com Course to a Playlist

- 1. Sign in to Lynda.com
- 2. Locate the course you wish to add to a playlist
- 3. Click the + Plus icon below the title of the course page
- 4. Select the playlist for the course

Notes: You can also add a course to a playlist from the course homepage by clicking the **Add to Playlist** button above the video player. You can't add individual videos to playlists at this time. You can also create a new playlist when you add a course to a playlist. When you click the Add to Playlist button on a course homepage, you will be prompted with an option to create a new playlist.

Learning Paths

- Playlists that focus on a specific career
- Good if you are looking at completing post-secondary education to ensure you are going into the right field or if you are looking to join a new workforce
- Videos focus on specific skills, tasks, or software that are essential for entering that career
- Number and length of videos vary in each career
- Overview available once you select a learning path





Notes, Transcripts, & Bookmarks

Features that help you pinpoint and remember specific information and deepen your understanding of the topic

Notes

- Integrated in the video player
- Take time stamped notes
- Select the Notebook tab on the top left of the video panel and type in your note
- Notes can be exported into a .doc, .pdf and .txt file

Transcripts

Most videos include a transcript of what the instructor is saying

- PRESS PLAY and demo following points
 - As the dialogue is spoken in the video, the transcript is highlighted and the transcript scrolls along with the dialogue
 - You can also turn on the closed captioning
 - Click in anywhere in the transcript and the video will sync up with where you clicked
 - The transcript is also searchable, so you can search for specific terms and go right to them

Note: The transcript feature is not available on the mobile app.

Bookmarks

The bookmark feature allows you to mark videos, helping you quickly pinpoint key course chapters or information you would like to review in the future.

- Add a bookmark to a Lynda.com course video
 - Log in to your Lynda.com account
 - Navigate to the course you wish to bookmark
 - In the left rail, select the Contents tab
 - Click the Bookmark icon next to the video you wish to bookmark

Exercise Files & Assessments

- Supplemental learning materials associated with many Lynda.com courses
- Assignments designed to reinforce skills
- Assessments (like Knowledge Checks) are quizzes to test your knowledge
- Exercise files are project files or informational documents that the instructor uses to teach the course
 - Only accessible via an Internet browser (can't be downloaded from either the mobile or desktop apps)
 - Not all Lynda.com courses include exercise files

Certificates of completion

- · Available for many courses and Learning Paths
- Share on social media including LinkedIn or print them out

Video Player

- Courses are taught by industry professionals in the form of video tutorials
- Use a video player within Lynda.com to watch the tutorials. You use the video tools to navigate within the player
- Contents tab
 - Shows all the chapters in a video
 - A blue eye appears next to the chapter title once you've watched it

- From the top right of the player you can:
 - Adjust the layout of the player
 - Add the video to a playlist
 - Share with others
- From the bottom right of the player you can adjust:
 - Playback speed
 - Closed captions
 - Settings icon
 - ☐ Dropdown menu where you can adjust
 - □ Video quality
 - ☐ Auto play
 - ☐ Pop-out the video player
 - Full screen
 - Mute and adjust the volume

Tips for searching and discovering content relevant to your interests

Searching for Lynda.com Courses or Subjects

Site Search

- At the top of each page, there is a search box
 - Use to find keywords from the course material and headings
- Advanced filtering displays to the left of the results
 - Narrow down the course results by:
 - ☐ Type (All, playlists, learning paths, courses, videos)
 - □ Subject
 - □ Author
 - □ Skill Level
 - □ Duration
 - □ Software/Version/Companies
 - ☐ More options (like closed captioning)
- Use quotation marks around the phrase to find exactly what you want
 - Example, search for "soft focus" if you're looking for training on soft focus techniques
 - Example green screen (~9400 results) vs "green screen" (~1100 results)

Search this course

- Find information from within specific courses
- Allows you to search the dialog, headings, and keywords
 - Any courses that have added closed captioning to will allow you to search the course material and will return results specific to chapters, specific videos, and specific time codes within videos

Note: Some older courses and new releases will not yet have this feature until their transcripts have been updated. If the feature is available, you'll see a search bar in the left rail of the course page on the Contents tab.



Requesting New Training Videos from Lynda.com

- New course content is added to the Lynda.com library every week
- Search the site regularly to discover new titles, or check your recommendations
- To browse new releases, check out the **New** section on the main page

Lynda.com Course Recommendations

- Your recommendations are created by comparing courses that you've viewed to other Lynda.com members with similar interests
- Based on your viewing history and your interests
- To access:
 - On main page, click Recommended
 - Click on My Profile and go to Recommended

My Interests on Lynda.com

Interests are the topics and subjects you're interested in learning about at Lynda.com. The Lynda.com algorithm uses your interests to help identify relevant courses for you from our online library. By updating your interests, you can generate more recommended courses for your online learning.

Update your interests:

- 1. Hover over Hi, [Your Name] in the top right of the page
- 2. Click My Profile
- 3. Click the My Interests tab
- 4. Check the boxes next to your categories or topics of interest
- 5. Click Save changes at the bottom of the page

Notes: You can remove interests by unchecking any checked box on the My Interests page. Interests must be updated from a desktop site at this time.
